#### Interscholastic Athletics Code of Conduct

# While attending athletic events on school property, all spectators are expected to behave in a sportsmanlike manner as outlined below:

- Accept the judgment and strategy of the coaches and not criticize players or coaches for a loss in a contest.
- Accept the judgment of the officials and not respond negatively to their calls.
- Applaud positive performance and not heckle, distract players, and avoid the use of profanity and obnoxious behavior.
- Exercise self-control at all times, modeling appropriate behavior for others to follow.

#### Unsportsmanlike conduct includes, but is not limited to, the following actions:

- using profanity, threatening comments, or biased language before, during, or after an interscholastic event.
- verbally harassing an official or participant (i.e., coaches or players from any participating school) by using names or uniform numbers.
- entering the field of play before, during, or after an interscholastic event.
- engaging in a physical altercation with an official, coach, player, school staff, school security, or spectator – before, during, or after an interscholastic event.
- using artificial noisemakers or other instruments intended to disrupt the interscholastic event or distract the participants during an interscholastic event.
- intentionally inciting participants or spectators to violent or abusive action.
- using obscene gestures or profane or unduly provocative language or action towards officials, opponents, staff, or other spectators.

- engaging in harassing, verbal or physical, conduct related to race, gender, ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation, or religion at an interscholastic event.
- any additional unsportsmanlike conduct or actions determined by the Principal or designee to be unsportsmanlike conduct or action.

If the unsportsmanlike conduct involves a potential criminal act, the Principal or designee shall immediately contact law enforcement.

## When a spectator at an athletic event on school property displays unsportsmanlike behavior, the following steps will be taken:

- Immediate removal from the event and school premises, followed by a suspension as outlined below:
  - First offense:
    - One-game suspension.
  - Second offense (within one calendar year of the first offense):
    - Suspension for the remainder of the current season.
  - o Third offense (within one calendar year from the first offense):
    - Suspension for one calendar year.

- Completion of required educational component(s) before attendance at future interscholastic events (see below).
- The Superintendent or designee, upon consultation with the Principal or designee, may increase the disciplinary actions outlined in this code of conduct, depending on the severity of the offense.
